The Principal, YCCE and Member Secretary of the BoM, Dr. U.P. Waghe, welcomed all the members and invitees of the Board of Management for the 31st Board of Management meeting.

Before taking the agenda of the meeting, the Member Secretary welcomed Prof. Petety Balaji, Professor, Bioscience, IIT, Bombay as UGC Nominee Member on the Board of Management of DMIMS by offering him a bouquet.

<u>Item No. 1</u>: Confirmation to the minutes of the 30th BOM meeting held on 28th March 2023.

The Principal, Member Secretary, BOM informed that the Draft Minutes of the 30th meeting of Board of Management held on 28th March 2023 were circulated to all the members of the BOM, requesting them to suggest modification(s) / correction(s) if any. Since no comments were received from the BoM members, Member Secretary requested Hon'ble members to approve the minutes. The BoM approved and confirmed the minutes unanimously.

Item No.2: Action Taken Report to the Minutes of the last Board of Management meeting held on 28th March 2023.

The action taken report on the actionable points of the last meeting of the Board of Management held on 28th March 2023 was placed before the BOM. While going through Item No.14(3) of ATR, the Principal-Member Secretary presented the status of Ph.D. faculty status. He told that only 11 faculty members have not registered for Ph.D. due to some faculty are on the edge of superannuation in the coming 1-2 years, whereas some faculty members who have not completed M.Tech. BOM Member Shri Sameerji Meghe asked to submit a list of those 11 faculty members, out of which superannuation faculty will be considered for non-registration. The Board of Management went through the report point wise and noted their satisfaction. BoM accepted the Action taken Report.

<u>Item No. 3:</u> To consider report of the Principal on status of admissions.

The status of admission for session 2023-24 of 1st Year (1st Sem.), 2nd Year (3rd Sem) 3rd Year (5th Sem) & 4th Year (7th Sem) B.Tech. The Principal-Member Secretary informed that the registration of Second Year B.Tech. & M.Tech. is in process for the academic session 2023-24.

The Principal informed that there are total 5959 UG-B.Tech. students on roll against intake of 5040 and 82 students PG-M.Tech. students on roll against intake of 228. Total 67 MBA students on roll against intake of 60 were admitted for newly started PG programme from A.Y. 2023-24.

BOM Members unanimously congratulated the Principal-Member Secretary for getting 100% admissions in B.Tech. and a good number of admissions in M.Tech. compare to last year. With these observations, the report of the Principal on status of admissions was noted by the BoM.

Item No. 4: To consider the report of the Principal on the academic performance of students.

Result of Summer -2023 (Even term) examination of programs under Autonomy for 1st year (2nd Sem), 2nd year (4th Sem), 3rd year (6th Sem) and 4th year (8th Sem) B.Tech. programs along with 2nd Sem. and 4th Sem. M. Tech. programs, was presented by the Principal.

BOM Member, Shri Sameerji Meghe pointed out the poor result of Electrical Engineering & Mechanical Engineering, he asked to study the reasons as to why result is poor and advised to take more effort so that the result can be improved and reach to the 70%.

Dr. Satish Wate, BOM Member asked to arrange remedial classes of killer subjects.

The report of the Principal on academic performance of students was noted by the BoM.

<u>Item No. 5</u>: To consider any matter in so far as it enhances the academic atmosphere of the institution.

The BoM went through the report No. 26 of Dean (Academic Matters) for Even Term 2022-23 for the period from Jan. 2023 to July 2023; presented by Dr. A.V. Patil, Dean (Academic Matters) –

- BoS meetings were conducted by various departments to review curriculum.

It was informed that, total 108 unfair means cases recorded whereas 107 students found guilty and have been punished. In 01 case given benefit doubt.

While reviewing the status of Unfair Means Cases, BOM Member Shri Ravi D. Meghe asked to submit full details of the students like name, year, branch from next BOM meeting (yearwise).

BOM Member, Shri Sameerji Meghe asked to submit a comparison report of last year and current years major cases from next BOM meeting.

With these observations, the report of the COE was accepted and approved by the BoM.

3) To consider and approve staff requirements with financial impact for the academic year 2023-24.

The committee members were briefed that, ratio of Faculty – Student as per AICTE Approval Process Handbook for 2023-24, for undergraduate programmes was 1:20. Considering the students intake for UG and PG programme and considering the autonomy workload, including that for new programme of MBA, increase in intake of CSE etc, **total 281 faculty** members required out of which 281 faculty members have been engaged.

It was further appraised to the committee members that for the current academic session 64 faculty members shall be on Adhoc basis. Therefore, approx. financial burden for those 64 faculty members shall be 25.60 Lakh pm (considering pm salary @Rs. 40,000 per faculty).

The committee noted the same and directed to fulfill the requirement as per statutory norms, as regards to faculty numbers.

(a) To enhance the faculty cadre ratio, a proposal of internal promotions of the eligible teaching staff members on the post of Professor and Associate Professor was put up for consideration. It was briefed that 34 senior cadre faculty members were superannuated from YCCE in last few years, resulted in decline in number of Professors and Associate Professors. It was informed that number of vacancy positions against available eligible staff members and its financial impact shall be as under —

Due to variation in starting salary slabs, depending upon qualification and experience, average salary per adhoc faculty is considered @ Rs. 40,000 per month. Therefore, the financial burden shall be Rs. 25.60 Lakhs per month towards salary expenses.

For the current academic year, the college shall engage 37 apprentices under NEEM, NAPS, NATS @ Rs. 10,000 to 15,000 pm stipends, which is over and above Govt. norms. Accordingly, the financial burden shall be Rs. 4.62 Laks per month @ Rs. 12,500 per person.

The committee approved the same and directed to put up above revision of approval of BOM.

The Principal, YCCE, Member Secretary of the BoM, Dr. U.P. Waghe, welcomed all the members and invitees of the Board of Management for the 32nd BoM meeting of YCCE. The following agenda items were discussed in the BoM meeting:

<u>Item No. 1</u>: Confirmation to the minutes of the 31st BOM meeting held on 18th Sept.-2023.

The Principal, Member Secretary, BOM informed that the Draft Minutes of the 31st meeting of Board of Management held on 18th September 2023 were circulated to all the members of the BOM, requesting them to suggest modification(s) / correction(s) if any. Since no comments were received from the BoM members, Member Secretary requested Hon'ble members to approve the minutes. The BoM approved and confirmed minutes unanimously.

<u>Item No.2</u>: Action Taken Report to the Minutes of the last Board of Management meeting held on 18th September 2023.

The action taken report on the actionable points of the last meeting of the Board of Management held on 18th September 2023 was placed before the BOM. The Board of Management went through the report.

The Board of Management went through the report and expressed their satisfaction on the same. BoM accepted the Action taken Report.

<u>Item No. 3:</u> To consider report of the Principal on status of admissions.

The status of admission for session 2023-24 of 1st year, 2nd year (4th Sem), 3rd year (6th Sem) & 4th Year (8th Sem) B.Tech., M.Tech 1st year and 2nd year (4th Sem) and 2nd year (MBA) presented by the Principal was reviewed in the meeting.

The Principal informed that there are total 5791 students on roll against intake of 5040 in B.Tech. programme. (I, II / III & IV Year U.G.) as well as a total of 84 students on roll against an intake of 168 students under M.Tech. programs. Also 67 students were admitted for PG-MBA program against intake of 60 students.

With these observations, the report of the Principal on status of admissions was noted by the BoM.

Item No. 4: To consider the report of the Principal on the academic performance of students.

The Member Secretary, BoM informed that the Odd Term Examination of B.Tech. 1st Sem. under the Autonomy is conducted and result for the same is delayed due to change in software. BoM Member Shri Sameerji Meghe & Shri Ravi D. Meghe expressed their worry for delay in declaring the result and advised to conduct a meeting with Juno Technicians to resolve the problem and declare the result at the earliest.

Whereas the result of Odd Term for 2nd year (3rd Sem), 3rd year (5th Sem) and 4th year (7th Sem) of B.Tech./ B.E. programs, PG-M.Tech. 1st Sem. & 3rd Sem. and 1st Sem PG-MBA result was reviewed by the BoM members.

The report of the Principal on academic performance of students was noted with satisfaction by the BoM.

<u>Item No. 5</u>: To consider any matter in so far as it enhances the academic atmosphere of the institution.

The BoM went through the report No. 27 of Dean (Academic Matters) for Odd Term 2023-24 for the period of July 2023 to January 2024; presented by Dr. A.V. Patil, Dean (Academic Matters) –

The report highlighted on –

- Registration of Regular Students in Odd Term 2022-23 Total 5862 (including 71 re-admissions) UG regular and 84 PG-M.Tech Regular students and PG-MBA 67 students were registered in Odd Term 2023-24.
- Readmissions / Re-registrations in Odd Term 2022-23 Total 71 readmissions have been done.

- Academic Calendars for UG and PG programs were published before the commencement of the Odd Term 2023-24.
- Feedback for UG & PG The feedback on the teaching Learning Process is obtained from students for Session 2023-24 to understand the effectiveness and also to remove the problems in the T&L Process. The feedback is obtained twice in a semester, the in-Semester feedback after 5-6 weeks of teaching and end-Semester feedback after 13-14 weeks of teaching.

BoM Member Shri Sameerji Meghe suggested to take action against those faculty members whose feedback is not satisfactory from last 3 years. He also advised to speak with senior faculty members whose name are in the Analysis Report and resolve the issue.

- Parent Teacher Meets The Parent Teacher Meeting was held as per Academic Calander during the Odd Term 2023-24.
- During Odd Term 2023-24, the students who failed to fulfill the criteria for attendance were detained as per the provisions of Academic Regulation.
- Special Mentoring Scheme during Odd Term 2023-24 the students who failed to fulfill the criteria for attendance were detained and registered for Special Mentoring Scheme (SMS).
- BoS meetings were conducted by various departments to review curriculum.
- Industry Research Professor Scheme conducted during Odd Term 2023-24 by various departments was presented which was reviewed by the BoM members.
- Details of Students Under Exchange Programme with IIIT, Nagpur was presented and reviewed by the BoM members.
- Faculty Position Total 281 faculty in various departments of the UG and PG Programmes were engaged.
- Details of Open Electives-I & II offered for various departments, credit transfer was also reviewed by BoM members.
- YCCE has registered in National Academic Depository (NAD) portal and has also registered in Academic Bank of Credit. Total 3562 students of YCCE have been linked with ABC. The process of uploading the results of NEP_2020 batch i.e. 2023-24 is in progress.
- As per the guidelines of AICTE New Delhi, University Grants Commission and NEP 2020, Courses from Engineering & Technology and from faculties other than Engineering & Technology is envisaged in the curriculum. YCCE is providing the courses based on technology, Indian Heritage and Culture, Universal Human Values, Vedic Mathematics, Yoga, Ayurveda, Sanskrit, Ancient Indian Languages, Music, and Classical Dance, etc. through various platforms.
- In all 154 courses from the basket of SWAYAM NPTEL were offered to the students. The credits for the successful completion shall be transferred in AY 2024-25
- In all 7 courses from the basket of KKSU ODL were offered to the students. The credits for the successful completion shall be transferred in AY 2024-25.
- In A.Y. 2023-24 total 240 students have registered for NPETL and KKSU courses for attempting credit transfer. On successful completion and production of valid certificate, the credit transfer shall be effected in A.Y. 2024-25.
- Details of Online Courses offered by Coursera, Honor/Minor Programmes offered in AY 2023-24 were also reviewed by the BoM Members.
- Details of various Events Held in YCCE during 2022-23 like First Year Induction Programme and Workshop/Seminar organized by the departments was reviewed by the BoM members.

With this the BoM accepted the report of Dean (Academic Matters) for Odd Term of 2023-24.

The Report of Controller of Examination, YCCE:

The BoM went through the report of CoE for Odd Term of 2023-24 for the period from July 2023 to Jan.-2024; as presented by Prof. D.R. Raut, CoE, which highlighted on—

Vide its GR dtd. 23.11.2023 revised slab of DA from **42% to 46% wef 01.07.2023**. Presently, the eligible staff members are getting DA @ **42**%.

The approx. financial burden per month shall be Rs. 7.84 Lakh pm for 222 staff members (Teaching 142 + 80 Non-teaching).

(D) It was informed to the committee members that YCCE has applied for NOC to RTM Nagpur University for filling up vacancy positions of teaching cadre as per Roster. The preparation of Roster as per Govt. of Mah. norms and approval shall be carried out during the period.

To make payment of arrears of DA due to hike in DA rates from 42% to 46% & proposed financial burden on implementation of DA revision w.e.f. 01.07.2023.

The committee members were informed that hike in Dearness Allowance (DA) from 42% to 46% effective from 1st July 2023 was approved for staff members who are receiving salary as per 7th pay commission. The arrear payable on account of revision of aforementioned DA, to the eligible staff members shall be during the financial year 2024-25 in the two equal installment and therefore the financial burden on implementation of the same shall be approximately Rs. 7.85 Lakh per month.

7) To Consider & approve proposed budgetary estimates of the college both recurring and non-recurring for the financial year 2023-24.

The budgetary estimates of the college (both recurring and non-recurring) for the financial year 2023-24 were presented before the Finance Committee. This is inclusive of additional 60 seats in Electronics VLSI, addition intake in Computer science engineering from 120 to 180, reduction in intake from 120 to 60 in Computer Technology and started Master of Business Administration (MBA) with Intake of 60.

After detailed discussion, the Finance Committee approved the budgetary estimates. The abstract of the budget approved for the financial year 2023-24 is as follows:

Total Inflows - Rs.8920.86 Lakh
Total Outflows incl. of Depreciation - Rs.9204.54 Lakh
Budgeted Deficit during the FY 2023-24 - Rs. 283.68 Lakh

The Finance Committee directed that the deficit should be mitigated through internal resources, better fiscal management and remainder if any through Bank Loans. It was further resolved that the same may be placed before the Board of Management in the ensuing meeting for approval.

8) To consider & approve proposed revenue budget with additional intake in the following discipline for academic year 2024-25.

- 1] Information Technology (IT) from 120 to 180 students.
- 2] Computer Technology (CT) from 60 to 120 students.
- 3] Artificial Intelligence & Data Science (AIDS) from 60 to 120 students.
- 4] Master of Business Administration (MBA) from 60 to 120 students.

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It was further informed that the proposed budget excludes intake of B.Tech programmes for "Working Professionals" (Three Years course) in the following discipline proposed to start from the academic year 2024-25. Therefore, the related expenses have not considered in this budgetary estimate. Further it was informed that the same will be incorporated only after actual admissions took place & after deliberations in this regard in the next meeting of Finance committee.

- 1] Civil with Intake of 30 students
- 2] Electrical with Intake 30 students
- 3] Computer Technology with Intake of 30 students

Apart from above, the College has applied for seeking admission from Foreign Nationals (FN), Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) and Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) from SAARC countries (Nepal, Bangladesh & Srilanka). If approved, total 108 admissions from five branches viz CE, ET, ME, CSE, AIDS shall be expected from aforementioned categories of students.

9) To consider the report on the appointment of new teaching staff with its financial impact including Internal Promotion scheme.

The Chairman was informed that additional 27 faculty members for academic year 2023-24 engaged on the salary of Rs. 47,000/- per month from January-2024, considering academic teaching load as per autonomy. Therefore, the total strength of faculty members for the current academic year, as on date is 308 faculty members which fulfill the statutory requirements. The committee members were briefed that the approx. financial burden due to engagement of above staff was is Rs.12.70 Lakh per month from Jan-24 onwards.

In addition to above 8 staff Promoted under Internal Promotion scheme of the Institute in the IT, CT, ME, CE, EL, EE & ECT and thereby, their fixation in the 7th pay was made resulted increase in financial burden of Rs.2.41 Lakh per month with effect from Feb-24.

10) To discuss the major findings of Internal Audit for the period 1stOct 2023 to 31st December 2023.

The major findings of the Internal Auditors in respect of the internal audit of the College for the period from 1st Oct 2023 to 31stDecember, 2023 and the status of its compliance was discussed on 29.02.2024.

11) To Consider & approve to collect co-curricular fees annually from the Batch 2024-25 onwards.

It was informed to the committee members that the college conducts various academic and co-curricular activities like Trainings, CRT, YCAP etc for all round development of students to meet-out current requirements under academic autonomy. It was therefore informed that to meet the expenses incurred for all those events, it was proposed to collect Rs.5000/- annually from all students of 1st year to be admitted from the academic year 2024-25 as well as 2nd year students of lateral entry. The committee proposes to charge this fees every year, thereafter from the batch of admitted students of 2024-25 till they graduated.



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
