

It regularly conducts technical lectures, career development programmes, guest lectures on personality development, resume writing, group discussions, interview techniques and, mock interview from senior company professionals.


Technical paper presentation contests are also held in collaboration with industries to discuss new technological developments and trends. It encourages and plans visits to the industries by the college students.



The refund of fees before cut-off date of admission shall be total fee minus the processing charges of Rs.1,000/-, or refund rule shall be as per the guidelines of the appropriate authorities or the State Government, as the case may be.

If the admission is cancelled after the cut-off date of admission declared by the Competent Authority, there shall be no refund except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit.

Scholarship For Students

The institute assists students for applying various educational funding schemes, as given below, and adopts procedures, guidelines of the State Govt.

- Scholarship and freeship schemes declared by Govt. of Maharashtra for SC / ST / SBC / OBC /VJ / NT category students.
- Religion based minority scholarship (Merit-cum-means based scholarship and state minority).
- EBC concession for open category admitted under CAP.
- · Teacher ward concession scheme.

Scholarships and Fee Waivers

Scholarships under social welfare are given to students generally in the form of fee waivers, on the basis of category, academic performance, although other criteria such as financial need, community or campus involvement, athletic participation and organizational affiliation are also given due consideration, as per the norms of DTE.

As a policy, the fee is waived, if the wards of faculty/staff of college/sister institutions are admitted to the course through the proper admission procedure. The amount of the fee waiver is 25% of the tuition fees in case of wards of the faculty/staff.

Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS)

(I) Scheme

- These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering Bachelor programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round.
- The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the State Level Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fee except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

(II) Eligibility

- Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats
- Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs.6.00 Lakhs from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

(III) Admissions Procedure

 These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

Discipline & Conduct

Anti Ragging

Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging

In view of the directions of the Honorable Supreme Court in SLP No. 24295 of 2006 dated 16-05-2007 and in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, dated 08-05-2009 to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institutions in the country, and thereby, to provide for the healthy development, physically and psychologically, of all students.

As per due provision of Maharashtra prohibition of Ragging Act 1999, ragging is a non-bailable cognizable offence. Whosoever indulges in ragging either directly or indirectly shall be liable for punishment amounting to imprisonment up to 2 years and fine of Rs. 10,000/- along with dismissal from our education institute. As per the directives from Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, ragging is non-bailable criminal and punishable offence.

What Constitutes Ragging

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has
 the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has
 the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely
 affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any student or a fresher
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students

Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd act, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Action to be taken against students for indulging and abetting ragging

- 1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents.
- 2. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FiR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- 3. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, with regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging.
- 4. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:
- · Cancellation of admission.
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- · Suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- Collective punishment: When the person committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.



Anti-Ragging Committee

As per directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, an Anti-Ragging Committee has been constituted as under. Any incidence occurring in and around the campus which may directly or indirectly amounts to ragging may be immediately brought to the notice of members of the committee, so that, appropriate action can be initiated against the guilty without delay. Discipline at the Institution

Attendance

The student must absolutely be regular in maintaining his/her attendance in theory and practical classes. In case the student's attendance is less than 75% at the theory lectures and practical separately, his/her term will not be granted.

As per the ordinance No. 6 of Nagpur University, pursuing of a regular course of study means attendance at not less than 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject of the course of instruction for the examination and in practical work wherever prescribed.

In case of any genuine reasons the student fails to confirm the required attendance, the student or his/her guardian must inform in writing to the authorities of the institution about the reason of absence in advance.

General Rules

- The students must remain present for all class tests and college assessment examinations.
- The student should complete all the term work such as journals, drawing sheets, workshop jobs or any other assignment as per schedule.
- If the student fails to complete the term work regularly and to the entire satisfaction of the head of the
 institution, he/she will not be granted term and will not be allowed to appear in the university end
 semester examination.
- The student should note that he/she is answerable to the authorities of the institution not only for his/her conduct in the premises of the institute but also for his/her general behavior.
- The student should not participate in any political and anti-social activities.
- The student should help in maintaining cleanliness in and around the buildings and the campus of the institute.
- Students must abide by the rules and regulations framed by the institute from time to time.
- For misbehavior of any nature, the student will be liable to severe punishment which may even lead to rustication.
- The student is expected to read the notices put on the notice board/website of the institution regularly.
 The institution is not responsible for any loss or damage caused to the student due to his failure to read the notices from time to time.
- Students should park their vehicles only in the specified area.
- Any change in the address of the student shall be communicated to the office immediately.
- Students shall carry their identity card in the college.

Faculty Advisor Scheme

A student or a group of students is assigned to a faculty advisor from the concerned department, who will mentor the student throughout his/her tenure in the institution. The students are expected to contact the faculty advisor on any matter relating to the academic performance and the courses they may take in the various semester/summer terms. The faculty advisor is assign to extend guidance to the students enabling them to complete to their courses of study for the required degree in a smooth and timely manner. The faculty advisor is the person to whom the parents or guardians can contact for performance related issues of their ward.

Library Rules

- 1. Only registered members are allowed to use the library.
- 2. Registered members are issued a Bar-coded Library Membership Card.
- 3. Library Borrower's Ticket (BT) is not transferable. BT is to be used only by the person to whom it is issued. Borrower's ticket should be looked after carefully.
- 4. In case of the loss of BT, new ticket shall be issued on payment as per library rules. Loss of BT must be reported immediately at the counter without delay.
- 5. Duplicate cards shall be issued only at the Librarian's discretion.
- 6. Entry to library is prohibited without BT/ID card.
- 7. Student membership of the library is renewed at the beginning of the year.
- 8. Members are responsible for books issued against their lost ticket.
- 9. Sub-lending of the document borrowed from the library is not allowed.
- 10. Periodicals, Exclusive Reference Books and Non Book material are only for references in library reading room.
- 11. Faculty and Students can borrow one reference book for 7 days.
- 12. Material for reading in the library shall be issued against the B.T. Please collect your B.T. before leaving the library. Library material issued for current reading against the card shall not to be taken out of the library.
- 13. Books issued will not be accepted back on the same day.
- 14. In case of loss of B.T./token fine of RS.100/- shall be charged.
- 15. Library can recall any issued book even before the due date.
- 16. The borrowed books have to be returned within the allotted period of 21 days for UG students and 30 days for PG students. In case of books returned after due date, the late fee will be charged at the prevailing rates.
- 17. In the event of a book being lost, damaged or mutilated, the member shall either replace it or pay the cost of the book. If any member desires that the lost or mutilated book should be procured by the Librarian, present cost of the book shall be deposited.
- 18. If the book is rare or out of print, he/she will have to get it photocopied or to pay such compensation as the Librarian / Principal may think proper. If the book belongs to a set or series & is not separately available then the whole set or series should be replaced.
- 19. Books are re-issued only once.
- 20. Deposit all your personal belongings at the Property Counter. You can carry any writing material and small wallet. No cash, valuables or calculator are to be left at the counter. The library will not be responsible for any loss or damage to your property.










Location Map
