Direction for Guidelines for conduct of ESE Even 20-21 on-line in view of lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic, w.r.t. Government of Maharashtra and RTMNU directives:

The Direction will be called as "Guidelines for conduct of ESE Even 20-21 on-line in view of lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic, w.r.t. Government of Maharashtra and RTMNU Notification 2020/60 dated 15-05-2020 and NMC Notification No 125/2021 dated 19.02.21:" and is being issued to facilitate 4th, 6th, 8th Semester Regular students BE, First Sem BE and M.Tech and Ex- students BE & M Tech as a special case due to COVID-19 Pandemic as per guidelines published by UGC, Government of Maharashtra, RTM Nagpur University Nagpur.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

"Guidelines for conduct of ESE Even 20-21 on-line in view of lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic, w.r.t. UGC, Government of Maharashtra and RTMNU Notification"

1. ESE Even 20-21 will be of Two hours for all papers (except mentioned specifically).
2. Students must use Mobile phone to join Google Meet through google classroom.
3. Students must write complete question paper on blank pages. 20 minutes will be given for writing question paper. EI (Exam In-charge) may extend question paper sharing time if required.
4. **Size of Pages for writing question paper and answers shall be - approximately 11"x7" (28 Cm x 18 cm) ruled pages or A4 size blank pages or Pages of register long book.**
5. Students are advised to join earlier to ensure their connectivity. The students joining late will not have right to ask extension of time for writing question paper or answer book. So be in time.
6. After login, **students must set their mobile on a stand in such a place that, it will cover the entire view of "student writing the paper"**.
7. Student must keep their video and audio ON during examination duration.
8. 10 mins will be given to the students after duration of paper 'for uploading pdf of scanned pages of the answers written by them.' After 10 minutes link will stop.
9. Examinee must scan the answer pages sequentially and convert it into a single pdf file for uploading.
10. File name shall be "RegistrationNumber_Course code_ddmmyy.pdf".
(Ex: If your Registration number is 19010123, course code is CV2101 and date of exam is 25-04-2021 then file name shall be 19010123_CV2101_250421.pdf")
11. 'Upload' the answer book pdf on Google Classroom. Mark yourself "turn in".
(In case of any problem in 'Uploading', whatsapp the file to Exam-In-charge immediately and contact him/her within 10 minutes.)



12. Any answer sheet uploaded after 10 mins will not be considered for evaluation under any circumstances and that student will have to appear for paper physically in college.
13. Charge your Mobile phone fully before start of examination and keep the charger ready with extension cable near the device.
14. Your Mobile phone will be connected to internet for 3 hours in every shift. Ensure the required data. (May be 3 GB to 6 GB or more)
15. You must use table chair for solving the question paper in a separate room. No one other than the examinee shall be present in the room.
16. If you have internet connectivity problem or electricity problem or separate room problem, or Mobile problem, declare it one week before start of examination by email on ar_exam@ycce.edu The college will make arrangements for such students to appear in Examination in college premises and provide them hard copy of Question paper / answer book to write in examination hall as per same timetable by following the norms of physical distancing.
17. Students must follow the above instructions. No compromise with sanctity of examination.
18. Examinee must cooperate invigilator and follow the instructions. Otherwise, Exam In-charge/invigilator will remove you from examination and recommend your next examination on campus.
19. Faculty will invigilate through Google Meet which shall be recorded throughout the duration of the examination.
20. Before start of examination, student must keep Required Pen, Pencil, Eraser, scale, calculator, Graph paper, Permitted Table, etc ready on table. Student cannot leave chair during examination for any reason till the end of the examination.
21. Students must check his "RegistrationNumber@ycce.in" email inbox for Invitation to join classroom a day before examination by 4 pm. In case of any issue, students must call Exam In-charge of respective department between 4.15 pm to 4.45 pm only. No calls will be entertained after or before this time slot.

GUIDELINES FOR CONDUCTION AND EVALUATION OF COURSERA ELECTIVES IN ONLINE MODE FOR SELECTED STUDENTS OF VI SEMESTER OF BE CIVIL ENGINEERING, MECHANICAL ENGINEERING & ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

The Direction will be called as "Guidelines for Conduction & Evaluation of Coursera Electives in Online Mode For Selected Students Of Sixth Semester Of Civil, Mechanical & Electrical Engineering Branches." and is being issued to facilitate 6th Semester Regular students of BE (Civil, Mechanical & Electrical Engineering) to opt for following COURSERA ELECTIVES in lieu of their regular professional Elective.

1. Deptt of Civil Engineering : CV2377-PE-II : CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT TECHNIQUES offered by Columbia University in the city of New York
2. Deptt of Mechanical Engineering : ME2379-PE-I: SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT, ME2380-PE-I: LAB. SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT offered by Rutgers the State University of New Jersey
3. Deptt of Electrical Engineering : EL2366- PE-I: Energy Production, Distribution & Safety Specialization, offered by University of Buffalo, The State University of New York.

Total TWENTY students each from VI semester Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering & Electrical Engineering will be allotted with these courses as professional elective based on their choice and merit.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

"Guidelines for conduct of Coursera Electives are as follows",

1. The Coursera Electives will be offered to 20 students each of 6th Semester BE Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering.
2. The cost of License for opting Coursera Elective will be borne by the College.
3. The students opting for this Coursera Elective shall be solely responsible to learn these courses in ONLINE Mode through the link and support provided by the college and complete all evaluations as directed by COURSERA.
4. The students successfully completing the allotted COURSERA Course before the date of commencement of End Sem Examination shall be provided with A⁺ grade in their marksheet.
5. The students who fail to produce the success certificate within stipulated time frame shall have to re-register for the same coursera elective (if available) or any other PE as listed in SoE as per the discretion of HoD.

The Direction will be called as "**Guidelines for Unconditional Carry-On To IloT Batch Students Admitted In AY 2021-22.**" and is being issued to facilitate Regular students and Ex students of B.Tech (IloT) to complete the prescribed term from AY 2021-22 to 2024-25.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

" **Guidelines for Unconditional Carry-On to IloT Batch Students Admitted In AY 2021-22 are as below**",

1. The IloT branch was started wef AY 2021-22 after necessary permissions from AICTE New Delhi.
2. The branch was closed wef AY 2022-23.
3. Since only one batch admitted in AY 2021-22 shall be operating for all four years, the students shall be provided with full carry on right from 1st to 4th year.
4. Therefore the eligibility criteria for promotions and admission to higher years shall be relaxed for IloT students.

Direction for "SoP for PhD Scholars Regarding Course Work"

The Direction will be called as "SoP for PhD Scholars Regarding Course Work", and is being issued to facilitate HoDs, Dean (R&D), research scholars and supervisors to complete the course of action as stipulated by RTMNU, Nagpur.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

Directions for "SoP for PhD Scholars Regarding Course Work", are as below,

PREAMBLE: Direction 27 of 2021 of RTMNU specifies the course work for the PhD Scholars. Based on this direction Board of Deans (BoD) of RTMNU, Nagpur issued the guidelines for course work. YCCE, being the autonomous institute for PhD degree will adopt the following standard operation procedure (SOP) for completion of PhD course work by PhD scholars as per the above guidelines.

The direction and SoP shall come into effect from AY 2022-23.

- All scholars admitted to Ph. D. programme shall be required to complete prescribed course work within one year after registration for Ph.D. programme.
- The credit limit for Ph.D. course work shall be of 12 credits.
- It will be necessary for PhD scholar to obtain a minimum of 55% of marks or its equivalent grade in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade/CGPA in a point system wherever grading system is followed) in the course work to be eligible to continue in the programme and submit the dissertation / thesis.
- 12 credits of PhD course work will be divided into three parts as stated below:
 - Research Methodology: - 6 credits
 - Completely in online mode by using portal of SWAYAM/NPTEL.
 - Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) (25 marks) and Semester End Examination (SEE) (75 marks).
 - Candidate should score min. 55% marks (50% in case of reserve category) as given in the direction.
 - Courses from type A is to be selected for registration using NPTEL portal (Refer – Annexure -A) and SoE of respective department as Open Elective – 1,2 and 3 respectively.
 - Seminar (2 Credits)
 - Presentation based on the literature survey/research topic. presentation will be of 100 marks.
 - The presentation is to be made before the Research Advisory Committee (RAC), preferably during first progress seminar.
 - Minimum 25 relevant research papers from refereed journals must be elaborated in the presentation on literature survey.
 - Distribution of Marks for Seminar should be awarded as per format given in Annexure -B.



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- Program / Dept. Specific Courses (4 Credits)
 - Courses offered at YCCE are in online mode.
 - Single course of 4 credits (60 hrs) for 100 marks is offered as shown in Scheme of Examination (SoE) as Professional Elective - 1.
 - The course teacher shall prepare hand-outs/material and distribute to the PhD scholar during the course work.
- Conduct of 4 Credit course by Institute: -
 - PhD scholar will select the Professional Elective – 1 from SoE of respective department with the consent of his/her supervisor.
 - PhD scholars need to register for the courses mentioned as per SoE of respective department in every semester.
 - Course teachers will allot the teacher assessment activities to the concerned PhD scholars and awards the marks for the same under TA for 20 marks.
 - End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course will be conducted for 80 marks on units defined in respective Professional Elective with equal weightage for each unit.
 - Question paper pattern will be all compulsory questions without any choice.
- Grade Conversion table for marks scored in Seminar, Research Methodology courses and Professional Elective (Total 12 credits) is as shown in Annexure C
- Completion certificate in the terms of Statement of the marks will be awarded to the scholars for PhD Pre-Registration course work as shown in Annexure D.

Direction for "SoP for selection of Most Outstanding Student (MOST)"

The Direction will be called as "SoP for selection of Most Outstanding Student (MOST)", and is being issued to facilitate HoDs and Dean (SA) to decide MOST and also to understand the aspiring student candidates about norms, rules and regulations for becoming MOST.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

Directions for "SoP for selection of Most Outstanding Student (MOST)", are as below,

PREAMBLE: The Most Outstanding student of a particular batch in an academic session is selected based on his/her overall performance during the four years of his/her graduation. The different criteria for selection and the standard operating procedure for the same is conveyed to the students right from the first year during their induction programmes. In 28th Academic Council meeting YCCE proposed SoP for selection of Most Outstanding Student (MOST) and the same was approved. The direction and SoP shall come into effect from AY 2022-23.

The SoP for selection of MOST s as follows –

1. Three nominations for the MOST are invited from each technical department before Project Submission as per academic calendar during Semester 8.
2. The departmental heads / SA coordinators are required to fill in the excel sheet for evaluation based on the performance of the student, provided to them by the office of SA. The format of the evaluation sheet is given below.
3. With the consent and permission of the Head of the department, the SA coordinators are supposed to mail the duly filled evaluation sheet, along with the documented proof of all the details entered in the evaluation sheet, to the Dean (SA) before the deadline.
4. Dean (SA) consolidates all the evaluation sheets and verifies the documents provided in support of the details entered in the evaluation sheet.
5. After the verification of documents, Dean (SA) evaluates the total marks secured by all the aspiring candidates.
6. After consolidation and evaluation, the MOST is selected based on the final score in consultation with the Evaluation committee members during first week of new session.

Direction for "GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)"

The Direction will be called as "GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)" and is being issued to facilitate Regular students to facilitate the detained student to make the loss of courses in which they are detained and avoid a loss of academic year.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

Directions for "GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)", are as below,

PREAMBLE: In 28th Academic Council meeting YCCE proposed abolition of Summer Term and a New Detention Policy. The academic council approved the abolition of Summer Term and a New Detention Policy, subject to condition to provide some additional chance so that loss of academic year of student may be avoided.

1. The proposed **MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)** is meant only for Detained regular Students as per newly proposed Detention Policy and not for Ex-Students. The maximum number of courses (including Theory & Laboratory) for registration under this policy shall be Three or less. In case a student doesn't fit in this criteria, he/she shall have to go for Re-Registration of entire semester as per existing norms. Prevailing eligibility criteria for promotion to higher semester will be applicable. The proposed **MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)** may also be extended to **RE-REGISTERED STUDENTS of SoE 22 absorbed students for selected courses with special permission of DAM.**
2. If, the student is detained, he/she will have to register the Theory / Laboratory course by paying fees Rs 5000/- Per course and contact the teacher as a mentor as allotted by HoD under "**MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)**" for doing self-study and submitting the assignments as per timetable given by the mentor. The ESE examination fees as applicable i.e., minimum Rs. 1000/- and maximum Rs. 2000/- shall be paid separately by registered students.
3. The time for this scheme will be from the date of detention to 7 days before the commencement make-up examination. The dates as per guidelines issued by DAM office and the departmental coordinator shall be applicable. There will not be any MSE examination for this scheme and the result will be declared based on **FOREGO MARKS** i.e., based on marks obtained in the End Semester examination.
4. Registered student must contact minimum 12 & Maximum 18 times with mentor within date of detention to 14 days before the commencement of makeup examination, as per the

timetable given by mentor. For laboratory courses, the students will visit the laboratory and complete all practical and submit the record as per the timetable provided by mentor. In theory course the student is mentored and permitted for submission of examination form on the basis of Course Completion Certificate by mentor whereas in laboratory course, the student must attend special 2 – 3 Laboratory session, perform all experiments, and submit the practical record and obtain Course Completion Certificate.

5. The mentor may or may not recommend the student and issue Course Completion certificate, to take exam depending on the performance/ response of the student.
6. With permission of HoD as per recommendation of mentor, student will have to submit the examination form along with Course Completion Certificate as per procedure by paying examination fees. Forego internal marks facility will be mandatorily applied while working under this scheme of registration.

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)

1. Only regular detained students shall be eligible to register under Makeup exam through Special Mentoring Scheme (SMS)
2. Maximum number of courses permitted to be register under the scheme is THREE (including Theory/Laboratory courses)
3. Students detained in ODD TERM is permitted to register in ODD TERM only provided number of courses are not exceeding THREE (including Theory/Laboratory courses)
4. Registration fees per course shall be Rs. 5000/- (for each Theory/Laboratory course)
5. Examination fees as per regular practice i.e., minimum Rs. 1000/- and Maximum Rs. 2000/-
6. The students detained will have to apply through a prescribed form to the HoD/FYC. The Coordinator for Special Mentoring Scheme (SMS) shall be Assistant HoD of the department for 3rd to 8th Semester detained students and FYC for 1st & 2nd semester detained students.
7. For theory courses the registered students shall do the following,
 - Meet mentor faculty minimum 12 to 18 times as per the timetable given by coordinator/mentoring faculty and seek guidance about self-study.
 - The attendance will be marked by the mentoring faculty by obtaining signature of registered students.
 - Minimum 12 assignments (2 on each unit) shall be submitted by the registered students.
 - Based on submission and evaluation of the assignments the mentoring faculty shall issue course completion certificate and certify the student for appearing in **MAKEUP EXAMINATION.**

8. For Laboratory courses the registered students shall do the following,
 - Meet mentor faculty minimum 4 times and visit Laboratory as per the timetable given by coordinator/mentoring faculty and perform all experiments.
 - The attendance will be marked by the mentoring faculty by obtaining signature of registered students.
 - The student shall perform all the experiments, prepare the record of the same, get the journal evaluated by faculty and complete the submission process.
 - Based on Journal submission and evaluation of Journal, the mentoring faculty shall issue course completion certificate and certify the student for appearing in **MAKEUP EXAMINATION**.
9. The registered student shall maintain,
 - Physical student dairy for theory courses, record all instructions from course teacher.
 - Submit the student dairy along with course completion certificate and undertaking about satisfactory completion of Self-study / performance of experiment to the departmental Coordinator.
 - Based on student dairy and course completion certificate, the mentoring faculty and coordinator will approve the examination form to be submitted to CoE.

GUIDELINES FOR DEPARTMENTAL COORDINATORS AND MENTORING FACULTY FOR MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS)

1. The mentoring faculty for a theory/laboratory course shall be decided by HoD/FYC in coordination with departmental coordinator.
2. Only regular detained students shall be eligible to register under Makeup exam through Special Mentoring Scheme (SMS)
3. Assistant HoD of the department for 3rd to 8th Semester detained students and FYC for 1st & 2nd semester detained students shall be the coordinator for SMS.
4. The coordinator shall obtain the application for SMS through prescribed form as per 'Annexure-A' format.
5. For the theory courses the mentoring faculty shall do the following,
 - Contact registered student/s and organize a meeting for explaining the methodology of self-study guidance, student dairy and also shall provide timetable to meet mentor faculty minimum 12 to 18 times as per the time table.
 - Provide the study and reference material, old MSE, ESE papers, notebook, and similar useful material in soft or hard form to the student to be helpful for self-study.

" **Guidelines For Detention Of Student In Regular Term** ", are as below",

PREAMBLE: In 28th Academic Council meeting YCCE proposed a New Detention Policy and abolition of Summer Term. The new detention policy shall come into effect for all admitted students of YCCE in AY 2022-23. The requirement of Attendance and proposed Detention Policy of YCCE is based on rules and regulations of UGC and of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU), Nagpur vide their DIRECTION NO. 14 of 2022, 'NORMS FOR OF ACADEMIC AUTONOMY - DIRECTION, 2022,

- A student must have an **overall 75%** attendance of total number of classes engaged including lectures/ tutorials and practical.
- Condonation of attendance can only be considered in case the **overall** attendance of the student is **minimum 60%**, that the deficiency in attendance was due to circumstances beyond the control of the student.
- For availing such condonation, a student will have to apply to the Head of concerned department/FYC along with requisite proofs / documents. However, the decision in this matter will be finally taken by Principal on the recommendation of DAM, HoD/FYC.
- Student who is not permitted to appear for the end semester examinations due to shortfall in attendance in a course shall be awarded 'I' grade in that course. This grade shall appear on the Grade Card till the successful completion of course requirements in that semester.

- The detained students may register for MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS) subject to maximum 3 number of courses (Theory + Laboratory) and can overcome detention, to avoid loss of ACADEMIC YEAR for a particular student.

If the regular student participates in esteemed extra / co-curricular activities in National or International level activity organized by government or by govt granted university during main end semester examinations at our institute, i. e. Process of Credit Transfer:

- 1) Students shall register for the desired NPTEL course ONLY from the YCCE approved list notified by DAM Office.
 - 2) Students shall register for the examination of the registered course at their own expenses.
 - 3) After the successful completion of the NPTEL course, following documents need to be submitted to DAM to claim the credits of Open Elective,
 - a. Registration confirmation mail from NPTEL
 - b. Receipt of payment of examination fees to NPTEL
 - c. Hall Ticket of examination issued by NPTEL.
 - d. Score Card / Certificate issued by NPTEL.
 - 4) All the documents need to be submitted to DAM office on or before 1st July 2024 for availing credit transfer of OE in III Semester. If student fail to produce the certificate in the given timeline, then DAM office will allocate the institute OE to that student as per his choice & merit.
 - 5) All students to note that,
 - a) To earn the credits of OE against the NPTEL course, student shall produce the course certificate to the DAM office in the stipulated timeline:
 1. At the commencement of semester 3 to avail the 2 credits of OE I, which is in 3rd semester - **on or before 01.07.24**
 2. At the commencement of semester 4 to avail the 2 credits of OE II, which is in 4th semester - **on or before 31.12.24**
 3. At the commencement of semester 5 to avail the 4 credits of OE III, which is in 5th semester - **on or before 15.06.25**
 - b) Student has to bear the NPTEL course examination expenses.
 - c) To earn the credits of the OE, student has to produce separate certificates of different NPTEL courses for each Open Electives.
1. The grade conversion and credit earning of the student in YCCE Curriculum shall be based on result of proctored examination conducted by NPTEL / SWAYAM as per Table No. 2 below.

"GUIDELINES FOR DETENTION OF STUDENT IN REGULAR TERM"

The Direction will be called as " **Guidelines For Detention Of Student In Regular Term**", and is being issued to regulate the attendance of students as per the rules and regulations of UGC and RTMNU.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

" **Guidelines For Detention Of Student In Regular Term** ", are as below",

PREAMBLE: In 28th Academic Council meeting YCCE proposed a New Detention Policy and abolition of Summer Term. The new detention policy came into effect for all admitted students of YCCE in AY 2022-23. The requirement of Attendance and proposed Detention Policy of YCCE is based on rules and regulations of UGC and of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU), Nagpur vide their DIRECTION NO. 14 of 2022, 'NORMS FOR OF ACADEMIC AUTONOMY - DIRECTION, 2022.

In view of implementation of SoE 23 as per NEP 2020 and vide Government of Maharashtra GR No: NEP-2022/(67/23) / DTE-2 dated 04.07.2023, the number of 2 credit courses like Liberal Learning Courses (LLC), Multi-Disciplinary Minor (MDM), Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Vocational & Skill Enhancement Courses (VSEC) etc have been increased.

In view of this a modification is necessary in allowing the students detention in more number of courses, and therefore following guidelines shall come into effect for the students admitted wef AY 2024-25.

- A student must have an **overall 75%** attendance of total number of classes engaged including lectures/ tutorials and practical.
- Condonation of attendance can only be considered in case the **overall** attendance of the student is **minimum 60%**, that the deficiency in attendance was due to circumstances beyond the control of the student.
- For availing such condonation, a student will have to apply to the Head of concerned department/FYC along with requisite proofs / documents. However, the decision in this matter will be finally taken by Principal on the recommendation of DAM, HoD/FYC.



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Principal's Direction No. 3 of 2024

- Student who is not permitted to appear for the end semester examinations due to shortfall in attendance in a course shall be awarded 'I' grade in that course. This grade shall appear on the Grade Card till the successful completion of course requirements in that semester.
- The detained students may register for MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS) subject to condition that the total NUMBER OF CREDITS are not exceeding '12 CREDITS', (Theory + Laboratory) in a semester and can overcome detention, to avoid loss of ACADEMIC YEAR for the particular courses. This limit when exercised for both the semesters can be **doubled** when calculated for ODD & EVEN term.
- Students not eligible for MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS), shall have to re-register (re-admitted) in the appropriate semester in next academic year and fulfil the attendance criteria as per the Academic Regulations of YCCE. The detention shall attract a loss of ONE ACADEMIC YEAR for a particular student.


This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management and shall be valid till 30.06.2027 or till the completion of course with special permission of Principal, YCCE.

Following are the guidelines for providing facilities, concessions and gracing in examinations, and valuation.

- 1) The student shall be allowed an additional 30 minutes during MSE examinations.
- 2) The student shall be allowed an additional 60 minutes during ESE examinations.
- 3) As permitted by Govt. of Maharashtra GR No. संकीर्ण-२०१६/ प्र.क्र. ३०२ /विशि-३ dated 04.03.2017. His/her evaluation during the MSE, ESE, Viva-Voce examination etc. shall be carried out keeping in mind the following points,
 - a) He/she may be allowed to write the answers to descriptive section questions in limited words as compared to other normal students.
 - b) He/she may be allowed to write long answer questions in key words/points
 - c) The valuers/Evaluators may check whether he has written relevant points related to answer and accordingly award the marks.
 - d) During Viva-voce these students may be allowed to answer in writing rather than vocal questions answer.
 - e) He/she is permitted to partially write his/her answers in Hindi/Marathi and same shall be considered while evaluation.
 - f) With the special permission of Principal/DAM he may be provided with a reader/supporter in case the student wishes to have the same.
- 4) As per GoM GR No. संकीर्ण-२०१६/ प्र.क्र. ३०२ /विशि-३ dated 04.03.2017,
 - a) His MSE and ESE answer book should accompany with valid certificate certified by Principal and DAM and shall be stamped as PWD student.
 - b) During the result declaration, he shall be provided with a grace of 3% of total marks of all credit courses in that semester. This grace can be divided and provided separately in different courses.

"GUIDELINES FOR DETENTION OF STUDENT IN REGULAR TERM FOR Y-CAP PROGRAM"

The Direction will be called " Guidelines for Detention of Student in Regular Term for Y-CAP Program" and is being issued to regulate the attendance of students.

This direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its approval by Board of Management.

" Guidelines For EVALUATION / DETENTION of Student In Regular Term for Y-Cap program ", are as below,

PREAMBLE: The Y-CAP (YCCE's Career Advancement Programme) is offered by YCCE for the students of III to VII semester of B.Tech programmes as an AUDIT course. The YCAP syllabus framing is carried out under the guidance of Training and Placement department and the execution is carried out by our sister concern **UPSKILL EDUCOM**. This programme is executed for 6 days in a semester in 2 spells each of 3 days comprising of communication skills and technical skills. Since YCAP programme is framed under the supervision of training and placement department (Dean, TP) the contents are highly useful from the point of view of placements of YCCE students in their final year. It has been observed that the YCAP Audit course is not seriously attended by the students, thereby hampering their chances of getting appropriate placement in their final year.

The following guidelines for the Y-Cap program's Attendance, Detention and Examination Policy will be effective for students admitted from the Academic Year (AY) 2024-25 onward:

1. Examination / Evaluation FOR YCAP

Overall Marks distribution

- The total evaluation will be of 100 marks. Distributed as follows
 - 50 marks for the Internal Exam
 - 50 marks for the End Semester Exam (ESE)

Internal Exam (50 marks)

- The Internal Exam marks will be based on the Pre-Test and Post-Test conducted during the Y-CAP session and shall be carried out during semester.
 - **Pre-Test** : Evaluate students initial understanding before Y-CAP training.
 - **Post-Test** : Assesses students improvement and learning outcomes after Y-CAP training.

ESE Exam (50 marks written test)

- A question paper that engages students for the full 3-hours duration
- Marks distribution for exam :
 - Communication skills : 25 marks
 - Technical Skills : 25 marks

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Question paper Preparation:

- Prepare 4 different sets of Y-CAP question papers shall be prepared by UPSKILL EDUCOM to ensure diversity and avoid repetition.

Post Exam paper checking:

- All answer sheets should be evaluated with 7 days after the ESE examination by the Manpower / Trainers to be engaged by UPSKILL EDUCOM.

Conduction Timeline:

- The Y-CAP ESE examination will be conducted along with the ODD/EVEN Semester ESE examination for the respective Academic Year.

2. ATTENDANCE CRITERIA FOR YCAP

A student must attend a total of 9 Y-CAP sessions, comprising of **3 days (6 sessions)** for Communication Skills and **3 days (6 sessions)** for Technical Skills.

- No condonation of attendance be considered in case the **overall** attendance of the student is **less than 75%** for whatsoever may be the reason.
- Students shall not be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examination (ESE) due to **< 75%** attendance AND will be awarded an **'I' grade** in YCAP course.
- The confined students must register for the **Y-Cap Exam** by paying a fee of **₹1,000** and must attend & complete a **mandatory 2-day training program** as notified by UPSKILL EDUCOM, after the End Semester Examination (ESE) of that term.
- The written ESE examination of such re-registered students shall be conducted at the time of RE-SIT Examination provided they have attended **mandatory 2-day training program**.

“Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines for ESE Odd Resit & ESE Even Resit Examinations”

The Direction will be called "Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines for ESE Odd Resit & ESE Even Resit Examinations".

This direction shall come into force with effect from academic session 2025-26 and approval by Board of Management.

Based on the recommendations and decisions made by the Examination Committee (EC), the following directions are hereby issued regarding the eligibility and conduct of the **ESE Odd Resit** and **ESE Even Resit** examinations. These guidelines shall be implemented with immediate effect and strictly followed from the academic session **2025–2026** onwards:

1. **Eligibility Criteria for ESE Resits:**
 - **Regular Students (Current SOE):**
 - Only regular students of the current Scheme of Examination (SOE) who **failed** in the most recent **ESE Odd** are **eligible** to appear in the **immediately following ESE Odd Re-sit**.
 - Only regular students of the current SOE who **failed** in the most recent **ESE Even** are **eligible** to appear in the **immediately following ESE Even Re-sit**.
 - **Absent Students:**
 - Regular students who have submitted the examination form for ESE Odd or ESE Even examinations and remained absent in the ESE Odd or ESE Even examinations are **NOT** eligible to appear in the corresponding re-sits.
 - Regular students who have not submitted the examination form for ESE Odd or ESE Even examinations are **NOT** eligible for ESE Odd or ESE Even re-sits examinations.
 - **Ex-Students:**
 - Ex-students (of any SOE) who appeared and failed in ESE Odd or ESE Even are not eligible for the immediate re-sit of the same.
 - Such ex-students may only appear in the next regular ESE Odd or ESE Even as applicable.
2. **Grade Cutoff Marks:**
 - For ESE Odd Resit and ESE Even Resit, the **same grade cutoff marks** used for regular students in the respective ESE Odd or Even shall be applied.
3. **Absolute Grading for Ex-Students:**
 - Any **Ex-student** (of current or old SOE) appearing in ESE Odd or ESE Even shall be awarded **grades based on absolute grading only**.
 - This policy is effective **from the academic session 2025–2026 and onwards**.

All departments and examination coordinating bodies are instructed to ensure strict adherence to the above directions. Any deviation shall be viewed seriously and may invite administrative action.

“Guidelines for Absorption of Students from Old SoE to NEP- SoE 2023 Structure”

The Direction will be called “Absorption of Students from Old SoE to NEP- SoE 2023 Structure”.

This direction shall come into force with effect from academic session 2025-26 and approval by Board of Management.

1. General Eligibility for Absorption into NEP-SoE 2023 Structure

- Students must clear the eligibility criteria prescribed under the Old SoE curriculum.
- Only those who qualify under the old scheme are eligible for transition into the NEP- SoE 2023 structure.

2. Absorption into Second Year

- Students must have earned **at least 60% of first-year credits**.
- Eligible students may be admitted directly into the **second year of the NEP-SoE 2023** with allotment of MDM Minor at Second Year level along with other regular students.

3. Absorption into Third Year

- Students must have **cleared all first-year subjects**.
- Additionally, they must have earned **at least 60% of second-year credits**.
- Eligible students may be admitted into the **third year of the NEP-SoE 2023**, Provided they have to clear MDM1 and MDM2 of second year since these students shall be getting a Major-Minor degree as per NEP SoE 2023.

4. Absorption into Final Year

- Students must have **cleared all subjects in both first and second years**.
- They must also have earned **at least 60% of third-year credits**.
- Eligible students may be admitted into the **final year of the NEP-SoE 2023**, provided they have to clear MDM1, MDM2, MDM3 & MDM4 offered in the second year and their year of NEP SoE 2023.

5. Simultaneous Registration for Pending Subjects

- Students transitioning to a higher year with pending backlogs from the previous year must:
 - Be simultaneously registered in the MIS for:
 - The higher year under the NEP- SoE 2023, and
 - The pending subjects from the Old SoE structure.
- These backlogs must be cleared as per the **final examination schedule of the Old SoE**.
- **Re-registration for backlog subjects is not permitted**; students must clear them through regular exams conducted by the Examination Section.
- Re-registration for backlog subjects of old SoEs is permitted only if both the subject and the corresponding curriculum are available under NEP- SoE 2023.

6. Multidisciplinary (MDM) Track Requirement

- For students admitted into the **second year**, the **MDM Track is mandatory** from that year onward.
- For those admitted into the **third year**, the MDM Track of previous year will be assigned based on NEP-SoE 2023 norms.
- Completion of **all MDM tracks is required** before course completion under the NEP- SoE 2023 structure.

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7. Eligibility for Dual Degree (Minor Discipline)

- Students absorbed into the NEP-SoE 2023 Scheme in the **second year** will be allotted the MDM track as per the prescribed norms.
- Students absorbed into the **third year** must **register for the second-year MDM subject via a makeup examination.**
- Students absorbed into the **final year** must **register for the second and Third year MDM subject via a SMS scheme through makeup examination.**
- Only students who **successfully complete the full MDM track** are eligible to pursue a **Regular Degree with Minor Discipline**, in accordance with NEP- SoE 2023 guidelines.

“Guidelines for Registration and Completion of MDM Track under SoE 2023 as per NEP 2020 for Ex-students”

The Direction will be called “Registration and Completion of MDM Track under SoE-2023 as per NEP 2020 for Previous SOE students absorbed under NEP SOE-2023”.

This direction shall come into force with effect from academic session 2025-26 and approval by Board of Management.

In accordance with the implementation of the Scheme of Examination 2023 (SoE-2023) under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, and as per the Government of Maharashtra GR No: NEP-2022/ (67/23)/DTE-2 dated 04.07.2023, the following guidelines are issued for students pursuing a Regular Degree with Minor Discipline (MDM):

As per Notification dated 02.07.2018 from DAM office, YCCE, the eligibility criteria for Admission to Higher Semester will be applicable. However, MDM courses ‘being additional courses for absorbed students’, will **not be counted** for eligibility criteria for admission to the higher semester for ‘the students absorbed under SoE-2023’.

Registration for Minor Discipline (MDM) Courses:

The students from previous SOE, who are absorbed under **NEP-SoE 2023** must register for the MDM track. After successful completion of the entire MDM sequence (MDM1 to MDM6) the student shall be eligible to receive a **Regular Degree with Minor Discipline**, in accordance with the provisions of NEP-SoE 2023.

1. Absorption of students from Previous SoE to SoE-2023 in Third Year:

Absorbed students will have to complete and pass MDM1 and MDM2 under SoE-2023 through SMS scheme. The D.C. students can complete MDM1 & MDM2 during their discontinuation period via the SMS scheme through makeup examination.


2. Absorption of students from Previous SoE to SoE-2023 in Final Year:

Absorbed students will have to complete and pass MDM1, MDM2, MDM3, and MDM4 under SoE-2023. The D.C. students can complete MDM1 to MDM4 during their discontinuation period via the SMS scheme through makeup examination.
