


How to reach YCCE website?







Abbreviations: -

ESE: - End Semester Examination.

Main Exam: - Odd ESE, Even ESE conducted immediately after teaching regular students.

Backlog Exam: - ESE Odd (Backlog), ESE Even (Backlog) are conducted for "F" grade students of all semesters. (Students who failed in previous examinations of any semester can participate in this exam as an Ex-Student)

Re-sit Exam: - It is an extension of main exam, conducted immediately after result of main exam either for Sem 1,3,5,7 as Odd Re-sit Or for Sem 2,4,6 as Even Re-sit. (The regular students who were present in the main exam for the course but failed are eligible for this exam for that course)

SOE (Scheme): - Scheme of Examination (Course, Credits, No. of lectures, Max marks, exam duration, etc.)

Regular student (R): - Attending the ESE immediately after first teaching learning process. Term Grant: - Successful completion of 'Teaching Learning Process' of the course.

Detained: - The course teacher does not permit the student to take ESE as 'Term is not granted' due to poor attendance or incomplete term work. Dean Academic matters notify it and CoE shows "I" grade in result i.e. Semester Grade Report.

SMS: - Special Mentoring Scheme (Only for detained students to appear in makeup exam).

Cut off marks: - 'Minimum & Maximum marks limit' for each grade.

Grace: - Additional Marks allotted to convert 'F' grade to 'D' (Check Rule for Grace marks).

Ex-student (Failed): - Repeater student reappearing in main exam.

Toppers: - Top ten regular students of that semester for that examination.

Merit List: - List of medal winners (Gold, Silver, Bronze) after completion of degree.

UMIC: - 'Unfair means Investigation Committee' to investigate copy cases during examination.

GRC: - 'Grievance Redressal Committee' to resolve Un-valued / Undervalued cases.

Result: - Declaration of "Grades" is called result. (Seeing answer book/ marks is not a result)
Semester Grade Report: - After declaration of results, Grade Reports are printed at COE office and distributed through student section in admin office. (Within 15 days after result)

Forego: - Student can leave his poor internal marks. Read the notice on web site.

SGPA: - Semester Grade Point Average.

CGPA: - Cumulative Grade Point Average.

Q.1: What is 'Name of ESE' (End Semester Examination)?

(Note: If the student fails in the first Main ESE & First Resit ESE, there after he/she will have to clear the course with absolute grading only by participating in Backlog exam.)

2-A) MAKEUP EXAM THROUGH SPECIAL MENTORING SCHEME (SMS):

Ans 2 A): SMS is a special scheme, offered for detained students at the discretion of the Institute & it is reflected in the academic calendar (DAM office).

- Students must approach DAM office immediately after detention for SMS registration.
- Students must approach COE office along with Course completion certificate, and Makeup exam form as per the notices displayed time to time on website.
- Do not wait for any personal message or personal invitation.
- Make up exam for "Detained Students" will be conducted along with existing examinations as per academic calendar. It's Exam form is offline.
- By default, "Forego" & "Absolute cut-offs" are applicable in Make-up ESE.

Q.3. How to get ESE Timetable?

Ans 3: To see End Sem Exam Timetable

- Visit college web site ycce.edu/ Examination Tab regularly.
- *Read the notes printed on the timetable.*
- *Note the time of every course. Shift may change from course to course.*
- *Be aware of the revised timetable from time to time.*
- Generally practical exams are conducted after theory exam unless specified.

Q.4. Can a student participate in the ESE without submitting an Exam form?

Ans 4: No. Submission of exam form in time is compulsory.

Q.5. How to participate in the ESE?

Ans 5:

- See relevant exam form submission notices on college website –
- (Control + click the following link)
- https://vcce.edu/exam-notices-3exam-form-instruction/
- Online examination form for Regular and Ex-students is made available through "Student's Log in".
- In case of any issue in exam form, students must report to COE on first day of link opening.
- Students must follow the steps. Verify the number of courses shown in the report. If less or excess courses are found, then report COE immediately.
- A failed student, reappearing in the Backlog exam, is called Ex-student.
- Immediately after publishing the results of main exams i.e., ESE Odd Or ESE Even on web site, Exam forms of failed students for Odd –Re-sit / Even –Re-sit are made available on-line through student's login.

Q.6. How can I get confirmation of acceptance of my on-line exam form?

Ans 6: Follow the steps given in the relevant exam form submission notice

- If you do not receive the pdf for 'acceptance of exam form', it means your form is not accepted. Try again with a strong network.
- If a problem persists, students must approach COE office immediately on the day one of the Link opening.
- Follow the schedule and avoid penalties of late fees.

Q.7. Shall I submit separate exam form for "Backlog Exam", "Make up Exam", "Re-sit Exam"?

Ans 7:

- Yes, they are different exams as per Q1 & Q2 above.
- See the relevant exam form submission notice.

Q.8 A. What does it mean by Ex-student?

Ans 8A:

 A failed student is called as Ex-student while re-appearing in any exam for that course till he clears that course.

Q.8 B. Can I participate in Odd Re-sit or Even-Re-sit exam though I have not submitted exam form in main ESE Odd / main ESE Even?

Ans 8 B:

• No. Further, the student who was absent for main exam due to any reason cannot participate in immediately followed Re-sit examination for failed course/s due to absence by any reason. Such students can participate in next backlog exam.

Q.9 Is Admit card necessary for appearing in ESE?

Ans 9:

- Yes. It is the responsibility of students to collect Admit card at appropriate time or at least 24 hours before day one of exam as per ESE timetable.
- Examinees are not allowed to enter the exam hall without a valid Admit card & Identity card
- Admit cards are made available before the detention list. If you are on the detention list, submit the Admit card to CoE office for correction & obtain a fresh admit card with remarks of detention.
- The detained student shall not appear on the exam of the detained course. Such answer books are cancelled by DyCOE and action is taken against such students for dishonoring the detention list.
- (Use of Unfair means Previous Copy cases)- The student who is not eligible due to UMIC Punishment, shall not apply / appear exam of that course till eligibility. Otherwise, action will be taken against such students.
- Read every instruction carefully which is printed behind the admit card.
- Do not write anything on the admit card. It is a UMIC case.

Q.10: What happens if I write "wrong question number" on answer book? Ans 10:

- You will get zero marks for that question.
- You must write the correct question number in the left margin / encircle the correct number printed on answer book.
- Do not write anything else on the question paper except your seat number.

Q.11: Can I see my evaluated answer books?

Ans 11: Yes, for the first evaluation only.

After first evaluation, answer books are shown 'on screen' via intranet at YCCE campus within 7th to 10th day from the date of exam of that course. Teachers are posting marks on class groups, if marks are not found before 10th day, contact HOD & COE immediately. Well, seeing the answer book or marks is not the result. Results are declared normally within 15 days from the last day of the exam. Students must collect their printed 'Semester Grade Report (Result)' from the student section within 15 days after declaration of result.

(Students must see answer books, before stopping the procedure of showing on 10th day. Do not expect any extension. It is a facility. One can't claim it as a matter of right.)

Q.12: - What is the procedure to see evaluated answer books? Ans 12:

- Showing Answer Book is a facility, do not claim it as a matter of right.
- For Steps to see your evaluated answer books of offline exam see the notice on website in examination tab- Exam Notice -1_ "See your Evaluated Answer Book Once."

Q.13: Can I apply for re-valuation?

Ans 13:

- Yes. You must apply on or before 10th day of the date of exam of that course.
- Use 'Grievance form 1' or 'Grievance form 2' as per requirement.

Note: If marks are changed after Re-valuation, the student must apply for a refund of the amount paid for revaluation to the admin office within one month from the date of notification of grievances.

Mention the notification number and date of notification in his application.

Q.14: If valuation is delayed, how can we see the answer books?

Ans 14:

- Showing Answer Book is a facility, do not claim it as a matter of right.
- COE may or may not give extra time for this. It depends on the situation.
- Students must meet personally to COE on 9th day from the date of exam.

Q.15: How 'Cut off marks' are decided and applied for Regular & Ex students? Ans 15:

- Read Question number 2 above.
- In every main exam i.e. ESE Odd Or ESE Even if the group size is ≥30, cutoffs are calculated for regular students as per the rules of relative grading system.
- Same cutoffs are implemented for immediately following Resit exam.
- Absolute grading is applied for preparing results of Backlog exam.
- Absolute grading for theory course is:
 - o (Marks- grade): 40-(D), 48-(C), 56-(C+), 64-(B), 72-(B+), 80-(A), 90-(A+)
- Absolute grading for practical course is:
 - o Marks- (grade): 50-(D), 54-(C), 58-(C+), 62-(B), 70-(B+), 80-(A), 90-(A+)

Q.16: If I score full marks or good marks in continues assessment, can I skip over ESE? Ans 16:

- No. You must appear & satisfy the conditions of minimum passing marks in ESE.
- If the conditions of getting GRACE marks are satisfied, one can get grace marks for passing.

Q.17: What is the system of grace marks for passing? Ans 17:

- Maximum two courses can get grace of maximum 'three marks' in each course.
- Grace is applied only if the examinee clears that semester after applying grace.
- Marks are calculated out of 100, then only Grace marks are thought off.
- Only 'D' grade is awarded by default for course which is passed by grace.
- Applying grace is a part of the result process in every exam you appear on. No application is required from students.

Q 18: My continues assessment marks are very poor. What can I do? Ans 18:

- Approach Dean (Academic Matters) to re-register that course again.
 - \circ OR
- Read the detail notice "Forego Internal Marks" on the college website.

Q 19: When are the results declared? When are the withheld results declared? Ans 19: Declared within 15 days.

- Results are declared within 15 days from the last date of examination (including practical).
- Seeing the answer book or marks does not mean result. You must see the grade report.
- Students must collect their printed Grade Report (Result) from the student section within 15 days after declaration of result.
- Withheld results are declared within 15 days after the result declaration process of all semesters.

Q 20: How to repair spelling /DOB/Mother Name, etc in printed Grade Report? Ans 20:

- The data entered by students at the time of admission is used on Exam form, Admit card, Grade report. In view of correction in document, the student must apply to Registrar, YCCE.
- Read the notice "Duplicate Grade Report / Spelling Changes" on college website in Examination tab / Exam Notices -1.

Q 21: What shall I do if I lose my grade Report?

Ans 21: The student shall apply to Registrar/COE, for issuing duplicate Grade Report.

Attach the following documents to application.

- Affidavit on stamp paper worth Rs100/- &
- Fee paid receipt from account section (Rs 500/- per lost grade report) for duplicate documents.
- Later, if the lost document is found, return the old one to Grade report section in COE office.

Q 22: I saw my evaluated answer book or Marks posted on group. Is it necessary to see my result on website & printed grade Report?

Ans 22:

- Yes. You must see the printed Grade card & must check the "Grades" obtained.
- Meaning of Result is Declaration of grades & SGPA.
- Printed "Grade Report" is treated as authentic document as a result.

Q 23: What is backlog Certificate? How to obtain it? Ans 23:

- It shows the number of additional attempts required for clearing the course/s. Those who apply for Job or Higher education, need this backlog certificate.
- Read the notice "Backlog Certificate- How to obtain?" on college website in Examination tab / Exam Notices -1 for application format and fee details.
